1. Co-produce a desirable future (shared vision)


- Future is to be invented

2. Define strategic actions


- Make choices
- Build on opportunities
- Dynamic constant formulation by testing and learning

3. Define the means

- Build partnerships
- Combine long-term objectives with short-term solution-oriented actions taking into account rapid change and the limitations of resources
- Use more strategic and dynamic spatial planning tools than classic masterplans

3. Methodology

1. Identification of strategic opportunities

- amalgamation of villages, landmarks, routes
- 2. Inventory of assets (natural, historic and economic)
- 3. Strategic Development Framework and selection of strategic projects
- 4. Detailed Urban Plans (DUP)
- **5. Implementation** (infrastructure works, new functions, selection of operators, communication/branding)
